

MINUTES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF STIRLING-RAWDON TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON DECEMBER 4, 2018

The meeting was called to order by the Chair.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

MOTION #1

“The Committee recommends that the Transportation Committee Agenda for December 4, 2018 be adopted as circulated.”

DELEGATION

Lyn Chapman attended to address two roads related issues. He explained the first is a hazardous situation at the intersection of Bateman Road and Stirling-Marmora Road due to a curve in the road just north of the intersection. He suggested if the 50 km/hr speed limit was extended 250m north of the intersection it would slow traffic and mitigate the risk.

The other issue is the condition of all gravel roads in our Township. He suggested that the aggregate that is used on our roads is bad.

The Chair thanked Mr. Chapman for his presentation.

MANAGER’S REPORT

George Burkitt, Public Works Manager reviewed the November Transportation Report with Committee. There was general discussion regarding snow plowing and cleaning of sidewalks etc.

OTHER BUSINESS

Roxanne noted that she and the Public Works Manager met with the property owner concerning the power line installed under the township road allowance, without permission. The owner has provided documentation that the same was installed in accordance with recommendations made by Hydro One and inspected by the Electrical Safety Authority. The owner is requesting permission to complete the installation, as started and that the deadline be extended.

MOTION #3

“The Committee recommends that Motion #2 of the November 6, 2018 Transportation Committee meeting be rescinded;

and further that the property owner shall:

- ~ install markers indicating the location of the road crossing;
- ~ provide proof that the said road crossing is registered with Pro Mark;
- ~ provide confirmation, satisfactory to the Public Works Manager, by March 31, 2019 that the work has been completed in accordance with Hydro One’s specification.”

MOTION #4

“The Committee recommends that for safety sake, a by-law to extend the 50km/hr speed limit on Stirling-Marmora Road north of Bateman Road be forwarded to Council for approval

and further that the same be advertised to make drivers aware of the change.”
