Stirling-Rawdon meeting highlights for April 2025

April 9 Standing Committees Meeting

- Monthly reports were received from the Environmental Manager, Public Works Manager, Fire Chief, BISB, BISB, and the CAO-Treasurer.
- The 2024-2025 Stirling drinking water system inspection report was received.
- The 2024 stormwater annual report was received.
- The 2024-2025 DWQMS management review was received.
- Complaint received regarding pothole patching.
- Report from the Fire Chief regarding the installation of a new door to a contamination room was received with a recommendation to approve at no more than \$2500.00.
- Reports from Pierce Animal Control for February and March were received.
- Correspondence received from Dave Bush regarding Front Porch Shenanigans was received with a recommendation that use of the Covered Bridge be granted, along with relevant road closures and that the organizer works with staff to develop a traffic plan for the event on May 31, 2025.
- 2024 annual report received from Stirling-Rawdon Public Library.
- Request from the Stirling-Rawdon BIA and Stirling Horticultural Society regarding the Christmas lighting ceremony on November 14, 2025, with a recommendation to approve use of the covered bridge along with the use of fire pits and that the planters at the old Mac's Milk property be used to create a promotional display for the event.
- 2025 levy apportionment notice and 2025 budget received from the Crowe Valley Conservation Authority.
- Correspondence received from Nehemiah Hubble Family Heritage Association requesting the Township establish a Cemetery Grant Program, with a recommendation that such a program not be established.
