

JULY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



July 2 Standing Committees Meeting

- Deputation regarding a by-law issue (barking dog) was received. Recommendation that the By-law Enforcement Officer provide a report back to Council on the matter.
- Monthly reports were received from the Environmental Manager, Public Works Manager, Fire Chief, BISB and BESB and the CAO-Treasurer.
- The following Fire SOGs were approved:
 - SOG 4012 Annual hose testing final 2024
 - SOG 5001 Use of SCBA Fill Station Final 2024
 - SOG 5002 North hall tanker operations Final 2024
 - SOG 5003 Wheel chocks and pylons Final 2024
 - SOG 5004 Hydrant procedures Draft 2024
- Recommendation that the Fire Chief bring forward a proposal for a Junior Firefighter program.
- Report received from the Deputy Clerk regarding a request for purchase of a road allowance. Recommendation to proceed.

- Request for road closure received from the BIA. Recommendation to approve in conjunction with a traffic plan being submitted.
- Correspondence received from Online Pavement Markings and Maintenance regarding an extension to current pricing for 2025. Recommendation to accept the extension and request work be completed by the end of May 2025, weather permitting.

- Report received from the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer regarding the Barking Dog Complaint – Investigation General Report.
- Motion to support the EOWC, AMO and FCM in calling on the Federal and Provincial governments to partner with municipal governments by investing in both new and ongoing maintenance and repairs of municipal infrastructure in Eastern Ontario's small rural municipalities.
- Motion to support AMO/OMA's joint health campaign calling on the Province to recognize the physician shortage in Stirling-Rawdon and Ontario and to fund health care appropriately and ensure every Ontarian has access to physician care.
- Motion to support Township of Terrace Bay correspondence call on the Provincial government to immediately implement sustainable funding for small rural municipalities by reabsorbing the cost of the Ontario Provincial Police back into the provincial budget with no cost recovery to municipalities.
