Stirling-Rawdon & District Recreation Centre Public Skating Rules

THERE IS A RISK OF INJURY ASSOCIATED WITH ICE SKATING.

Persons using this arena do so at their own risk.

- -It is strongly recommended that all skaters wear protective equipment, but especially the children wear helmets, gloves/mitts and be accompanied by an adult at all times if under the age of 8.
- Chairs, sleds, strollers, pylons, pucks, sticks and other obstructions are not permitted of the ice during the Sunday public skating time.
- -All participants must wear skates while on the ice surface.
- -Food and drink are not permitted on the ice surface.
- -Power skating or games such as tag, racing and crack the whip are not permitted.
- -Hockey and/or figure skating manoeuvers are not permitted.
- -Inappropriate language or behavior will not be tolerated at any time in the Recreation Centre.
- -No skating backwards.
- -Please skate at a sensible speed in the direction chosen by arena staff.
- No headsets, cell phones or hand held electronic devices are to be used while skating.
- -Leave the ice surface immediately when the skating session is over.
- -Wheel chairs are allowed but person controlling the wheelchair must wear skates. Please keep wheelchair next to the boards and away from skating traffic.
- -Report all accidents or injuries, misconduct or hazardous conditions to area staff immediately.
- No throwing of snow or ice.

Please be courteous and respect other people's property. The Recreation Centre is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen items.

To ensure a safe and friendly environment the Stirling-Rawdon & District Recreation Centre asks that you observe the above rules. Anyone breaking these rules will receive a warning and if they continue to break the rules they will be asked to leave the facility by arena staff.
