**Stirling-Rawdon, ON-** The Township of Stirling-Rawdon is pleased to announce the receipt of COVID-19 Resilience Infrastructure funding in the amount of \$100,000 from the Federal and Provincial governments.

This funding will be used to rehabilitate the outdoor space by updating the former skateboard park with a new concrete pad, upgrading of the present trail system with a designated asphalt surface walking area and to assist with the installation of an accessible public washroom facility.

During the COVID-19 pandemic indoor facilities have been closed to the public. The rehabilitation of outdoor space will benefit the health and well-being of the residents of Stirling-Rawdon by allowing them to safely participate in outdoor activities.

“This is a project that supports the best of Stirling-Rawdon for its citizens and visitors as we emerge from the year of COVID,” said MPP Daryl Kramp. “I am pleased to see this project approved and moving forward to enhance outdoor recreation in Stirling-Rawdon.”
